Young Adult Studies: To serve the young adults in the area, I began a bi-weekly study through the book of Daniel. As many of you know, we have never achieved full-support in 2020. We made the move to Kentucky based on our faith that the work needed to be done, that my responsibilities were here, and that God would provide. During the summer, when the bank account was looking a little slim, Anna brought in the mail and there was an unexpected card from out of state. Inside of the card was an encouraging note along with a check for \$1,000. We immediately offered a prayer of thanks to God for those sweet saints, and how God used their gracious gift.

As of this report, we have received commitments of \$4,566.00 toward our \$6,500.00 monthly goal (this amount includes one time gifts). However, we have been made aware that two congregations who have supported us from the beginning of our work here will not be able to continue while another church has picked us up. When the dust settles, we will be at a loss of \$800 a month beginning in March of 2021.
