- 2. What is one of the primary lessons the book of Daniel teaches about Nebuchadnezzar's spiritual growth?

- 3. What kind of men did Nebuchadnezzar select, and what did he select them for?
- 4. How old might Daniel have been when he was chosen, and why should that impress us?

Daniel 1:8-16

- 5. What problem did Daniel and his friends initially face after being selected (see Lev. 11)?
- 6. List the process Daniel followed to resolve the problem.
- 7. List what Daniel DIDN'T do when faced with this problem.
- 8. What did other young people in the Bible do when they encountered adversity and temptation far from home?

9. What stands out most to you from these five verses and why?
